But much work and coordination still needs to be done. We'll need people to purchase and collect food, to package the food and transport it, for example.

This new opportunity is a wonderful chance to increasingly live out our mission of following the teachings of Jesus by sacrificially serving people who are marginalized!

‘Good Negroes’ exhibit through February

An art exhibit titled "Good Negroes" is challenging viewers' thoughts about racial inequality in the St. Louis region. The exhibit opened at the Gallery at Webster Groves Christian Church on Monday, Jan. 18, and runs through Feb. 28.

This exhibition seeks to take a look at what it means for black people in the region to “be happy.” The artists hope to address what happiness looks like, whether it is found through participation in protests, or in following the unwritten rules that serve as foundational for St. Louis in order to not make social or cultural waves.

WGCC Legacy Fund Financially Supports the Church

The WGCC permanent fund, named the Legacy Fund, has provided financial support to the mission and ministry of the church since its creation in 1995.

The original deposit creating the fund at Christian Church Foundation was for \$5,024.17. Over those 20 years, saints of WGCC who have gone before have given \$1,090,180.52 to the fund. The funds are invested and overseen by the Foundation. Each year, WGCC draws 4% of the investment balance and uses those funds to support the church's mission and ministries.

In those 20 years, \$650,720.76 has come back to the church and used for mission and ministry.

Over the years, average investment returns have exceeded 4%, growing the fund balance to \$1,241,450.71 at the end of 2015, well over the amount invested!

In the current church fiscal year, \$52,000 will be drawn from the investment, which is 14.5% of the entire church's budget.

Gifts to the Legacy Fund truly become the gift that keeps on giving, and in this way, our gifts can offer impact to the mission and ministry in perpetuity, long after we are gone, just as the gifts given by those before us continue supporting the church today and in perpetuity.
