



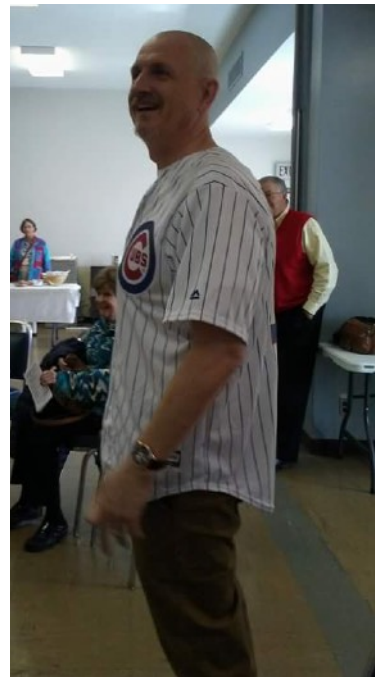
Celebrating a perfect 10 with the Moores

An outcry from our youth

Youth and adults of The Christian Church of Mid-America Christian Regional Youth (CRY) Cabinet met in St. Louis hosted at WGCC in March.

They started out by making signs and planning a pre-march worship Friday night. Saturday was a full day with leading the pre-march worship at Compton Heights Christian Church sharing why they felt moved to march, protesting in the March For Our Lives (a movement dedicated to student-led activism around ending gun violence and the epidemic of mass shootings in our schools today), volunteering at Doorways and playing Bingo with the residents living with HIV/AIDS, visiting the Cathedral Basilica and receiving a blessing from a priest, continuing CRY Festival and planning WGCC's Palm Sunday worship, to finally repackaging laundry detergent for Webster-Rock Hill Ministries client use.

The CRY Cabinet led the entire service and connected Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem to their weekend experiences. WGCC members shared this during the worship:

"Some of my friends say that participating in events like the Walkout on March 14th will never make a difference, even though history has proven the opposite. For however long it takes, I will walk out and protest until something is changed. I hope that future generations will not have to go through a revolution such as this." - Ben Pugh, high school freshman

"Experiencing a march first-hand was a surreal experience. It was empowering to know that I had a voice, and freedom, to express my feelings about issues that plague this country. I am rarely part of such a collective movement, that right in front of me brought people of different faiths together." CRY Vice-President Khotso Moore, high school sophomore
