
Round up a foursome



Dear members and friends of WGCC,

Having just completed 10 years as your pastor, it's time for another three-month pastoral sabbatical to rest, pray, reflect, and refresh for our next season of ministry together. My sabbatical period will be from July 1 through September 30. My first day back will be exciting, since it's October 1 – the day of our second Golf Tournament to support the work of the Kirkwood Area Every Child Promise!

During my sabbatical I'll be praying for each of you and for the life and ministry of our congregation. In addition to resting and enjoying time with my family, I'll be doing biblical research for my ongoing preaching and teaching at WGCC and Eden Theological Seminary, working on the manuscript of a book on Revelation & Tolkien, and doing some traveling.

I won't be attending worship or meetings at WGCC during this time, and I won't be available by phone or email during these 3 months.

Our WGCC Staff, Board, and Visiting Disciples team will continue to do the great work they always do, and we are arranging for preaching and emergency on-call pastoral care during this period. 
