### Tee up to be the change in our community

The Promise: All Kirkwood children and families are prepared for success as they enter kindergarten.

In 2017 passionate Kirkwood leaders came together and formed this promise statement. They had observed a racial achievement gap that had formed in their community and they felt moved to begin a movement to own this promise.

# WGCC and KAEChP

In order to fulfill our mission to serve the most marginalized of our community, Webster Groves Christian Church has partnered with Kirkwood Area Every Child Promise to to ensure that children and their families are prepared for kindergarten. The Golf Tournament is the primary fundraising event for KAEChP. Webster Groves Christian Church will receive 50% of the first \$30,000 earned by the golf tournament to provide space in our building for KAEChP programs such as:

- Office and activity space for Parents as Teachers
- Promise Place, a clothing and equipment closet to provide families of young children with needed items
- Expansion and new equipment for Project Now
- An upcoming new early Head Start program

As a result, Kirkwood Area Every Child Promise (KAEChP), a local non-profit, was founded and works with community partners to:

- 1. Provide scholarship support to families who otherwise might not be able to afford access to quality educational opportunities
- 2. Ensure the health and mental health of children and families by creating pathways to nutritional and wellbeing programs and services
- 3. Create networks of mission aligned people who rally around KAEChP's promise to the community.

The promise is simple - we must be the change in our community for these children.

Fulfilling this promise requires resources from individuals and organizations throughout our community.

On Monday, Oct. 1, 2018, we will be hosting our second annual KAEChP Golf Tournament in support of this promise. The tournament is a great event held at Westborough Country Club, with lunch, dinner and a silent auction included. In our inaugural year we raised \$10,000 and our goal is to double that amount this year.

KAEChP's mission is fulfilled through support of Parents as Teachers, Promise Place infant and toddler diapers, clothing and safety items, scholarships to partner preschools, Nutrition on Weekends, and community programs and events. Tournament proceeds will go toward meeting KAEChP's goals of providing

space, programs, and resources for the educational, nutritional, physical, mental, and family wellbeing of young children living in the Kirkwood area. Your sponsorship will help prepare Kirkwood area children and their families for success as they enter kindergarten.
