

We are working with the EyeSeeMe book store (https://www.eyeseeme.com), specifically for African-American children, as a partner in this project. This store is presently located in a small space in University City. Hopefully within the next couple of months we will have a section on their web page dedicated to our project and some of the books we would like to have. Those wishing to support this effort will be able to order the books from the webpage. Purchases will be free of tax as the store has our tax identification number. Those wishing to go to the store to purchase need only indicate that they are doing so as a purchase for WGCC. How easy can this be!?! Of course not all books should be focused on families of color. We are also beginning to work with Barnes and Noble for some of our new book purchases.

The first book to be given to all families in their Sept. 7-9 weekend NOW bag is Corduroy by Don Freeman. First published in 1968, this book is a beloved classic enjoyed by many. Proceeds from the sale of Corduroy over the years have been given to charities helping children with illnesses, disabilities and traumas.
