

Help dismantle the STL divide

On Nov. 12, a workshop focused on the impact of racism on housing in the metro area, including the 63119 zip code, will be held in the Fellowship Hall at Webster Groves Presbyterian Church. The workshop is presented by Faith and For the Sake of All and sponsored by WGPC and Emmanuel Episcopal Church.

The workshop takes a faith-based approach to move participants from understanding housing data to taking action for change and is based on the community-driven report *Segregation in St. Louis: Dismantling the Divide*. The report presents an extensive history of our region's use of segregation housing policies and practices, concluding with key recommendations to dismantle our significant divides.

In addition to the data report, Webster Groves City Council member Laura Arnold will bring these issues home to the 63119 zip code, discussing housing issues in Webster Groves and ways the city could begin to equalize housing opportunities in its neighborhoods.

The workshop will be held at Webster Groves Presbyterian Church at 7 p.m. It is free and open to the public. Registration, however, is required.


Affton fair for Salvation Army
