Sunday morning sermon: "Inclusion: A Witness to God's Inclusive Love and Grace"

Luncheon presentation: "The Clobber Texts: Texts of Exclusion in Context"

This session will examine the seven biblical texts often used to justify churches' exclusion of LGBT persons. It will explore these texts in the historical and cultural contexts which they addressed.



John Bracke taught Old Testament and congregational leadership and administration at Eden Theological Seminary in St. Louis for 28 years before retiring in 2012. During his time at Eden, he served as academic dean for 14 years.

While teaching at Eden Seminary, John frequently taught adult education classes, served as a retreat leader, or consulted with churches of several denominations.

An ordained minister in the United Church of Christ, John has served the denomination in both regional and national settings. In retirement he and his wife Mary live in Columbia, Mo., where they are members of Columbia United Church of Christ.
