How you can hike against hunger

Memorial Boulevard Christian Church is asking that you and your family consider hiking against hunger.


For 45 years this has been a group activity with proceeds going to parts of the world decimated by hunger.

Although we can't hike together this year, you are urged to hike with vour family this summer, to get sponsors and perhaps take small video clips of your hike that we can share during worship.

The goal this year is to raise \$13,000 and the focus is going to be on native communities in two regions of Guatemala - the Maya Ixil region and the Maya Mam region. This multi-pronged project will study malnutrition in children; work to empower communities in understanding their basic human rights (emphasizing the right to food); and establish an agricultural cooperative in each region that helps commercialize agricultural products and increase family incomes. The program will impact 917 families, 4,585 people.
