Elston is also the 1st Vice President of the St. Louis City NAACP where he chairs both the Environmental Justice and Prison Committees. Elston is looking forwarding to completing his Contextual Education (Internship) at Webster Groves Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) this school year.

Pastor McCowan served as the Moderator of the Fellowship Outreach District, Inc. of the General Baptist State Convention of Missouri from 2010 - 2018. Rev. McCowan currently serves on the Board of Directors for The Alliance of Parents & Children for Educational Empowerment, Inc.

As a lifelong St. Louisan and community organizer, McCowan is often seen advocating for the removal of toxins from City Neighborhoods, schools and other institutions. He also can be seen advocating for the humane treatment for prisoners in State Correctional Facilities and local jails and the eradication of food deserts that can mainly be found in North St. Louis City.
