The Hike project this year is to bring God's love to the people of Tanzania's rural communities.

- Developing income generating activities raising of chickens and more gardening tools for horticulture.
- Rehabilitation of a community center the girls' orphanage is in need of more beds, an incinerator and more beds with blankets for the girls
- Transportation in the form of their own motorcycle which will reduce their current
