#### How it all added up:

Disciples Women is completing another year of study, fellowship and service. Due to Covid restrictions most of our service has been through financial donations. Each year DW prepares a budget to fulfill and as always the women have accomplished this goal.

Treasurer Julie Wood reports we sent \$2,000 to the church-wide Outreach Fund, \$800 to the Mid-America region (that includes WGCC), \$225 to the Blessing Box collection and we budgeted \$350 for the NOW fruit. In addition to our DW budget commitment, WGCC Disciple Women topped the giving scale in 2021-2022 service donations beyond our budget commitments. Remembering those we helped through Service:

- NOW families and children received food and clothing
- Webster-Rock Hill Ministries families aided with laundry soap TWICE this year.
- Promise Place family received baby gear for a new baby
- Men at MBCC received winter socks, hats, gloves, scarves
- Doorways individuals and families enduring HIV received needed supplies for their homes
- Church community at Memorial Boulevard Christian Church helped with utilities and other life support needs
- WGCC Neighbor Fund helping Pastor Jeff provide aid where needed
- AND, of course our long-standing gift of food bags and gifts at Thanksgiving and Christmas to NOW and WRHM.

We accomplished this with the individual giving of Disciple Women members through DW Service, totaling \$2373.35!
