WGCC receives sabbatical grant

WGCC has received a Clergy Renewal Sabbatical Grant from the Lilly Foundation. The grant, intended to support congregations and clergy through providing funds for clergy to pursue restful, engaging, and renewing sabbatical experiences, is for \$50,000, and includes approximately \$40,000 for Pastor Jeff's four-month sabbatical experience in 2023, and approximately \$10,000 for congregational costs and activities related to the sabbatical period.

Pastor Jeff will be on Sabbatical from May 21 through September 21, 2023, and he will be riding his motorcycle to 24 countries around the Mediterranean Sea, visiting sites related to biblical and church history. Pastor Jeff will share stories, pictures, and videos from his trip upon his return. WGCC members will be encouraged to help select one Global Ministries mission partner from each of the continents (Europe, Africa, Asia) Pastor Jeff will visit, and to learn about that partner. Jeff will schedule visits with these three mission partners while he is on his journey. A list of possible partners will be shared via Weekly Updates during October.

Special thanks to the congregation and WGCC Board for their support of the grant process, and to committee

members who worked with Pastor Jeff to prepare the grant application: Carole Hughes, Keiler Swartz, Breona Hawkins, Robin Woodrome, Kay Love, Laura Stuetzer, Carolyn Dyess, and Pat Roseman!


Take a virtual trip with Disciples Women's group


Oct. 2: Reconciliation Special offering
