Reminder: You can still donate through the reverse Advent Calendar; put aside a designated food item into a large box or bag each day during Advent.


# Be Ready: An Advent Devotional

In a program with Webster/Rock Hill Ministries, we will be donating gift cards.


You can look for the tree in the hallway. Take an ornament and buy a gift card and return the card to the church by December 11.

### **WGCC** Board to vote on changes to Legacy Fund

At their last meeting, the WGCC Board voted to approve that undesignated testamentary funds from deceased individuals given to the church will be split 90%-10% with 90% going to the Legacy Fund and 10% to be tithed to Missions Outreach with the specific mission determined by the Church Board or their designee, eg. Missions Committee.

Currently 100% of such funds go to the Legacy Fund. If such funds donated to the church are designated with a specific purpose, 100% of those funds will continue to go towards that purpose as intended by the donor. As required by the Legacy Fund policy, this vote is only the first step to enact this policy change.

This notification to the congregation is the second step. In the final step, the board will vote again in two-weeks time and if 3/4 of the board votes to approve, this will become the distribution policy for all undesignated bequests left to Webster Groves Christian Church.
