#### Pastor Jeff starts sabbatical on May 18

Pastor Jeff will begin his four-month sabbatical on Thursday, May 18. He will return to his regular pastoral duties on Thursday, September 21.

Thanks to the hard work and creativity of WGCC's Sabbatical Grant Team (Breona Hawkins, Carolyn Dyess, Pat Roseman, Keiler Swartz, Robin Woodrome, Kay Love, Carole Hughes, Laura Stuetzer), WGCC was awarded a Clergy Renewal Grant through the Lilly Foundation. The grant will pay for Pastor Jeff's motorcycle trip around the Mediterranean to visit biblical and historical sites. Grant money will also fund a program and celebration at WGCC when Pastor Jeff returns this fall, as well Bible study materials to be used by WGCC members and friends while he is away (focusing on scripture and our understandings of our past, present, and future as people of God),

and costs related to providing a parttime sabbatical pastor.

We are grateful for all of the prayers and effort that have gone into planning this sabbatical.

After attending Abbie's PhD graduation at UVA and spending a week with his family at a lake house, Jeff (and Webster, the church mouse!) will depart for Heidelberg, Germany, where he'll reunite with his motorcycle and begin his 20,000+ mile trip around the Mediterranean, visiting sites connected to biblical stories and characters, and our wider mission. Pastor Jeff intends to vlog about his experience, and will hopefully be posting videos on YouTube at "Rev around the Med." Thanks to everyone whose prayers and efforts have helped to make this sabbatical possible!

#### Can we meet the Stewardship Challenge?

Our WGCC 2023/2024 program budget passed unanimously at our recent congregational meeting. It is a budget that affirms care for our building, investment in our staff, and the importance of our programs of worship, education, outreach, care, and compassion.

Our budget also relies on investment income from our Legacy Fund and the use of savings from previous years' surpluses. We've run some numbers and we've found that if WGCC members and friends were to commit to increasing our giving by 7-10% each year for the next several years, we would be able to meet the financial challenges and opportunities of sharing the Good News from this place.

Will you join us in committing to increasing your giving to support the important mission and ministry of our congregation?

Here's an example: Let's say you gave \$500 last year to the general fund of the congregation - right around \$9.60 per week. A 10% increase would be challenging you to give \$550 next year - right around \$10.58 per week - an increase of less than \$1 per week. The following year, you'd be challenged to give \$605 - an increase of just over \$1 per week. You get the picture.

If we all commit to prayerfully and generously growing our giving in increments from our current commitments, WGCC will be able to continue to provide mission and ministry in all of the ways we currently do. If you did not give to the general fund of the congregation last year, we strongly encourage you to begin this year. The ministry we share is made possible through God's grace and our gifts. Together we empower mission and ministry "from our doorsteps to the ends of the earth."

We want to keep her involved in service. There is a lot of opportunity for her. Without being TOO pushy, let her know


about the various ways she can serve.
