# General Assembly paves the way for the Disciples road ahead

For the first time in four years, the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) in the United States and Canada is gathering in person for its General Assembly. This year's gathering is in Louisville, Kentucky, and runs through Tuesday, Aug. 1.

The General Assembly receives and acts upon proposed policy and program, reports and resolutions, and other items of business presented during business sessions.

Among the resolutions addressed this year:

• A calling for the Church to oppose Christian Nationalism.

• An invitation to oppose antitrans legislation and affirm the dignity of transgender and gender-diverse people.

• A resolution addressing food waste, food insecurity and environmental justice.

• A resolution building on our Church's commitment to faithbased investing.

Did you know an estimated \$100 each month is often spent by families for diapers? That's each child. Suppose there are two diaper-clad kiddos in the family! For a young family this is a necessary item in their struggling budget. It isn't that families have a choice on buying diapers. Diapers are a requirement at day-care. They are also a health-care necessity

According to a survey by the National Diaper Bank Network to meet the required number of diapers needed for day care, low-income families had to cut back on household expenses, often miss work or school due to the diaper issue and even give up meals to buy diapers.

At WGCC, our Disciples Women have donated diapers to Promise Place, which is Kirkwood Area Every Child's Promise/KAEChP resource that helps low-income families. BUT WGCC can do more! Each member of Webster Groves Christian Church can help! We suggest August as Donate for Diapers month. HOW DO WE DO THIS?

Since its founding in 2014, St. Louis Area Diaper Bank has accepted donations of money and diapers. Working with many organizations areawide, the Diaper Bank distributes FREE diapers to low-income families. YOU can be a Diaper Donor by donating one of these ways:

## Volunteer with refugees at HIAS Welcome Corps

**HIAS** is the oldest refugee agency in the United States. Today they work with refugees, volunteers, and community partners around the world from all faiths, nationalities, and backgrounds. They provide life-saving support to refugees in the U.S. and in 20 other countries; they have also been leading the



work of private sponsorship with Afghan and Ukrainian newcomers in the last two years. They are currently looking for sponsor groups to participate in the new Welcome Corps refugee program. For context, Welcome Corps was recently launched by the U.S. government and allows everyday Americans to support refugees and help them build new lives in the U.S. Sponsor groups are composed of 5-8 people and welcome refugees by securing housing, greeting them at the airport, enrolling children in school, and helping adults find employment. Most importantly, sponsor groups offer a sense of welcome and inclusion for refugee families.

# What's cooking at MBCC?


