The next Disciples Women luncheon will be September 7 at noon in the chapel - and everyone is invited to attend!



# Rev. Terri Hord Owens re-elected as General Minister for Disciples

The General Assembly of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) re-elected Rev Teresa "Terri" Hord Owens to a second term as General Minister and President of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) in the United States and Canada She is the first African American and second woman to lead the denomination – and the first African American woman to lead a mainline Christian denomination

Rev. Owens was installed and charged with continuing her ministry of visionary love, spiritual leadership, prophetic imagination, and ecumenical service. In her sermon during closing worship, she invited the General Assembly to "imagine new ways of being church and to stay at

the table no matter what we face. Our commitment to staying at the table is grounded in our covenant relationship with God and with one another."

Rev. Owens is regarded in the ecumenical world as "head of communion" and as the chief representative of the church in national and world

ecumenical councils. In keeping with the Disciples' historic commitment to Christian unity, she serves in leadership at the National Council of Churches as the Treasurer of the Governing Board and as a member of the World Council of Churches Central Committee. Her ecumenical and interfaith

collaborations also include the Faith Table, an interfaith social justice coalition.

Prior to being elected to serve as General Minister and President in 2017 she served as the dean of students for 12 years at the University of Chicago Divinity School, pastor of First Christian Church of Downers Grove in Illinois, and more than 20 years in corporate America leading diverse teams in data management.

In addition to collaborative service with the ministries that comprise Disciples Justice Ministries, she has been active in leadership in the Poor People's Campaign.
